DPW REPAIRS & MAINTENANCE IN VILLAGE

IT WAS BROUGHT TO DPW'S ATTENTION THAT A CURB STOP WAS DAMAGED FOR VILLAGE HOME, BY THE RESIDENT. IT ALSO CAME TO DPW'S ATTENTION THAT UNDER VILLAGE LAW SECTION 7: REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

**THE VILLAGE OF COPENHAGEN BOARD OF TRUSTEES
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Section 7. Repairs and maintenance.

- A. It shall be the responsibility of the property owner to repair and maintain the service pipes from the Village's curb cock or shutoff to and into the building serviced. All leaks in piping, appliances and outlets shall be promptly repaired by the property owner. If such repairs are not promptly and properly made the Village Water Department may discontinue service to the property owner upon twenty-four hour notice. Any such discontinuation of service shall be for cause under the provisions of this chapter.
- B. Any damage to the Village's curb cock or shutoff caused by the property owner or any person hired by the property owner shall be repaired or replaced by the Village Water Department, and the cost of labor provided by the Village at the prevailing wage in effect for the Village plus the cost of the materials shall be charged to the property owner. Any such charges not paid within 30 days from the date of billing shall be subject to the provisions of Section 9 of this law.

SO THUS FORWARD, ANY DAMAGE TO CURB COCK OR SHUTOFF NOT BY DPW, SHALL BE REPLACED AND REPAIRED BY DPW; THE PROPERTY OWNER WILL BE BILLED FOR LABOR AND COST OF MATERIALS. THE PROPERTY OWNER WILL HAVE 30 DAYS TO PAY, AND IF NOT DONE SO THEY WILL BE SUBJECTED TO PROVISIONS OF SECTION 9 OF VILLAGE LAW.

THE VILLAGE CLERK WILL BE ALSO SENDING OUT A LETTER IN THE WATER AND SEWER JANUARY BILL, SO EVERYONE IS AWARE AND ON THE SAME PAGE.

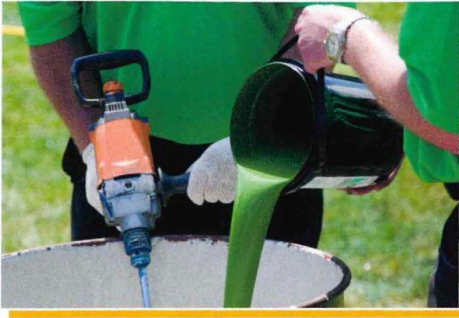
